# AIMING YOUR LIFEMISSION

## KEY TAKE-AWAYS:

## SUMMARY

As we learned, Jesus has a specific process for growing a leader. As we aim for your LifeMission, a review of this process is necessary. Just like in the days of His first disciples, you have been hand-picked by Jesus for specific Kingdom work. Jesus has a vision for your future. Hopefully, you're beginning to see that vision and are taking His training seriously. He's asked you to follow Him. This will lead us to a crisis of our faith and belief in His vision. To prevent an aborted LifeMission, you must practice what you're learning.

Regarding LifeMission's focus, a "sales" or "service" emphasis is best. The Sales component is the proclamation of the Gospel of Salvation to the lost. Service is disciplining people who say yes to Jesus to practice the Gospel of the Kingdom. Both are needed, and most are capable at both, but specialize in one based on their Potential/Passion/Purpose. Either way, you will be confronted by the enemy. A person walking in their God-designed LifeMission is a powerful thing the enemy cannot ignore. Therefore, as Jesus and the original disciples, you must neutralize the enemy.

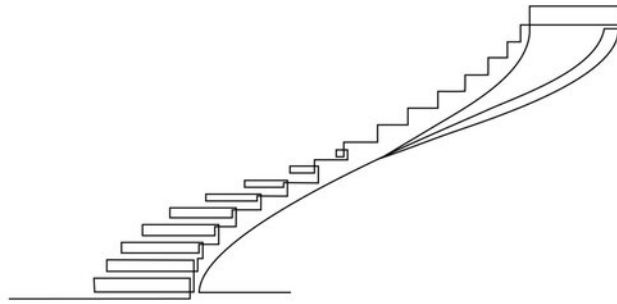

## SUMMARY

The standard mindset is six days for worldly work and one day for church. Sometimes church creeps in the workweek, but always discreetly. The **BATTLE READY** mindset is that every day is Kingdom work. Our time does not change our identity; our identity as a Jesus follower shapes how we view every minute. Therefore, as we shift our work efforts from a successful career to a significant Life Mission, we capitalize on all our marketplace talent and experience.

As we learned from Session 5, you have experiences that give you more authority. Mixed with your talent, the authority of experience is a powerful and influential force. Review all 12 categories of your Distinguishing Characteristics. This time, focus on how your experiences in all 12 areas give you more authority in the Kingdom space. ## SUMMARY

The process of something great fails without preparation. We can undoubtedly charge out our front doors with our hearts on fire to do amazing things, but how will we sustain passion and ensure we hit the target we set out towards? What will keep us from falling prey to a complacent approach to life? The answer: a Kingdom Life Plan.

The Kingdom Life Plan highlights critical points that will help you stay faithful as you move forward. Most certainly, new learnings and course adjustments will occur along the way. The best practice is to schedule a quarterly review of your Kingdom Life Plan to maintain focus and adjust course when needed. This refinement process is even better when done in a community with others focused on LifeMission!

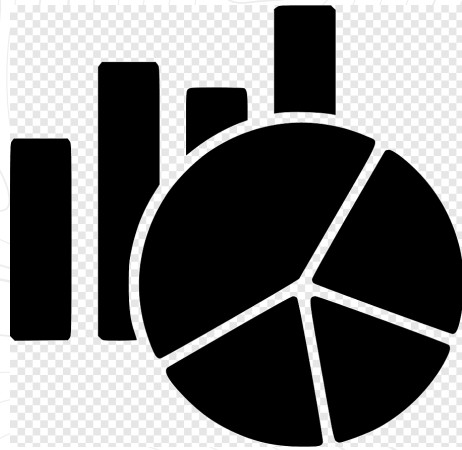

## KEY TAKE-AWAYS:
